Fall Forum Highlights

The following are the highlights from the Special Meeting and Fall Forum, held on October 17-18, 2023:

- 1. Corporate Members and Alternates convened for the Special Meeting of RTOERO to consider three motions regarding restructuring the membership fee.
- 2.The proposed 2024 budget was presented to Forum participants.
- 3. Forum participants provided input as part of the ongoing organizational naming process that will involve gathering such input from all members and stakeholders.
- 4.Gayle Manley, Chair of the Benefits Committee, highlighted the review process for the 2024 plan and the performance of the plans. Notice of plan changes for 2024 will be shared in Communiqué in mid-November.
- 5. Forum participants shared effective district practices to engage members and advance the RTOERO strategic goals.
- 6. Forum participants received a presentation from Dr. Leeno Karumanchery, a diversity and inclusion, expert on power & privilege.
- 7.A summary of the 2023 District Executive Survey and the May 2023 Annual Meeting post- event survey was presented to Forum participants.

BENEFIT PLAN REMINDERS

- 1. You have to be able to prove your departure date from Ontario when you travel out of province. This includes crossing into Minnesota (I Falls, Baudette). This includes crossing the US on your way to Winnipeg and not just a holiday out of province.
- 2. Health coverage for couples can include the member and another dependent. Family health coverage can include the member and two or more dependents.
- 3. Prescribed medications can be for up to 100 days (three months) supply. They are covered up to 100% for generic drugs and 90% for branded medicines. This has a cap of \$3400 per person covered by their plan.
- 4. A tax-free savings plan is an excellent way to protect and save your earned wages. This is limited to \$6000 per annum.
- 5. Income splitting is another good method of getting the most for your dollar.

Decision at Special Meeting - Membership Fee

- RTOERO membership fees for members enrolled in the Entente Group Insurance Program will be financed through income earned on long-term investments, Subject to inflationary adjustments.
- Annual district grants per member will be set to a base year as calculated for 2023, and subject to yearly membership growth and inflationary adjustments. This shall not apply to districts receiving minimum grants per Policy 9.02b.
- 3. An operations reserve will be created to provide assurance of 3 years of estimated fee revenue.

If you retired or will be retiring from teaching this year, your 2024 adjustment will be prorated for the time you were on pension in 2023.




